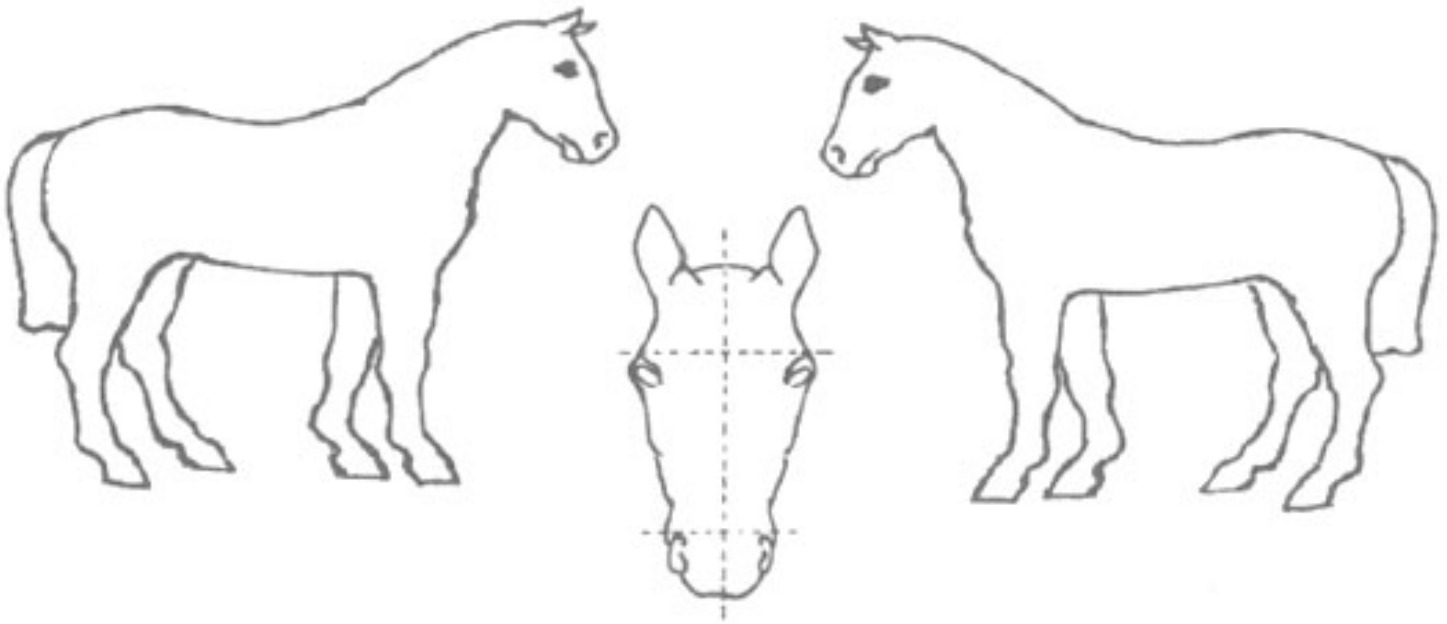

Shire Sport Horse Registration Procedures

1. Qualifying Parents:

The Shire parent must be registered with ASHA or a recognized sister registry.

The non-Shire parent must be a horse between 700 and 1400 pounds.

A DNA type to be used in parentage verification must be provided for each parent. (See note under Procedure.)

2. Process:

Application must be made on the SSHR application form.

If not already available to ASHA, the DNA or blood-type case number of the non-Shire parent must be provided. (A new DNA sample is also acceptable; see Procedure.)

If the non-Shire parent is registered, a copy of the registration paper must be provided to ASHA.

Every applicant horse shall be DNA-typed and parentage-verified.

3. Ownership:

SSHR registration papers shall show the dam's owner at the time of foaling as the first owner of a registered Shire Sport Horse.

Transfers shall be recorded with the SSHR at each change of ownership.

4. Fees:

Registration: \$125. Fee includes DNA kit for applicant horse.

Transfers: \$40. (\$80 for transfers occurring after January 1, 1999 and not submitted within six [6] months of date of sale.)

5. Procedure:

Submit the following items to the ASHA office:

1. Completed SSHR application form;
2. Copy of registration of non-Shire parent, if available; and
3. Check payable to SSHR for \$125 for DNA testing and registration of the sport horse.

In addition, the following items may be required:

Check for \$40 to cover blood-type-to DNA-type conversion of the Shire parent if the parent's blood-type is owned by ASHA; **OR**

Check for \$25 to cover entering a DNA type of the Shire parent from a foreign laboratory into the database at the Veterinary Genetics Laboratory (VGL), UC Davis;

AND

DNA case number of the non-Shire parent if DNA-typed at VGL; **OR**

Blood-type case number of the non-Shire parent if blood-typed at VGL, plus a check for \$40 to cover conversion from blood-type to DNA-type; **OR**

Check for \$40 to cover the cost of new DNA kit and DNA-typing of the non-Shire parent.

The additional items above are required only once for parents of sport horses; check with the office if you are not sure what to send. The DNA kit for the sport horse (and for the parent[s], if ordered) will be emailed shortly after receipt of the sport horse application and payment. The time required to complete the registration is likely to depend on the availability of the parents' DNA types.

If the non-Shire parent of a sport horse cannot be found and does not have a blood type or DNA case number available to ASHA, the applicant horse must qualify to the Shire parent, and a sworn statement from the stallion and mare owners must be filed attesting to the breeding and foaling; a fee (equal to the fee charged by ASHA for DNA-typing one horse – currently \$40) shall be charged for acceptance of this statement.
