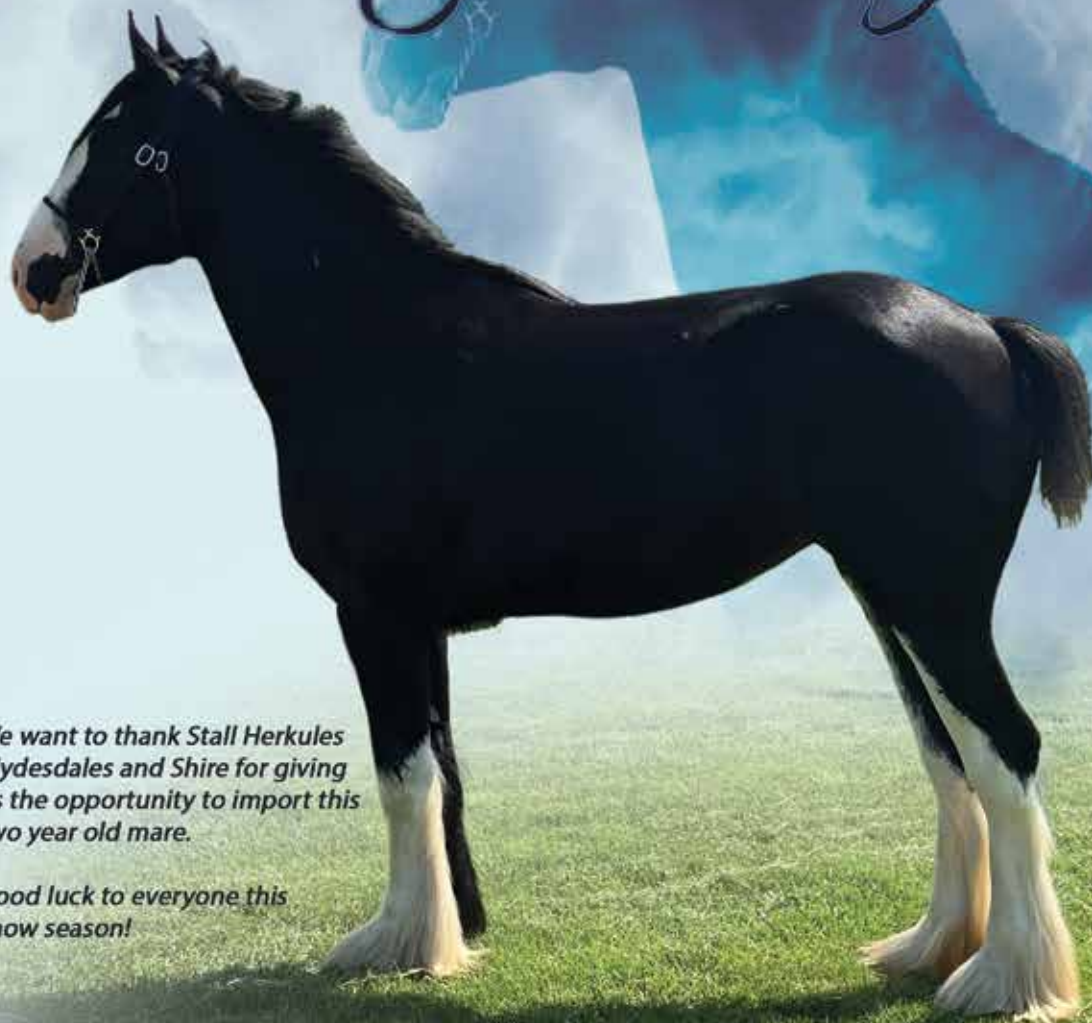

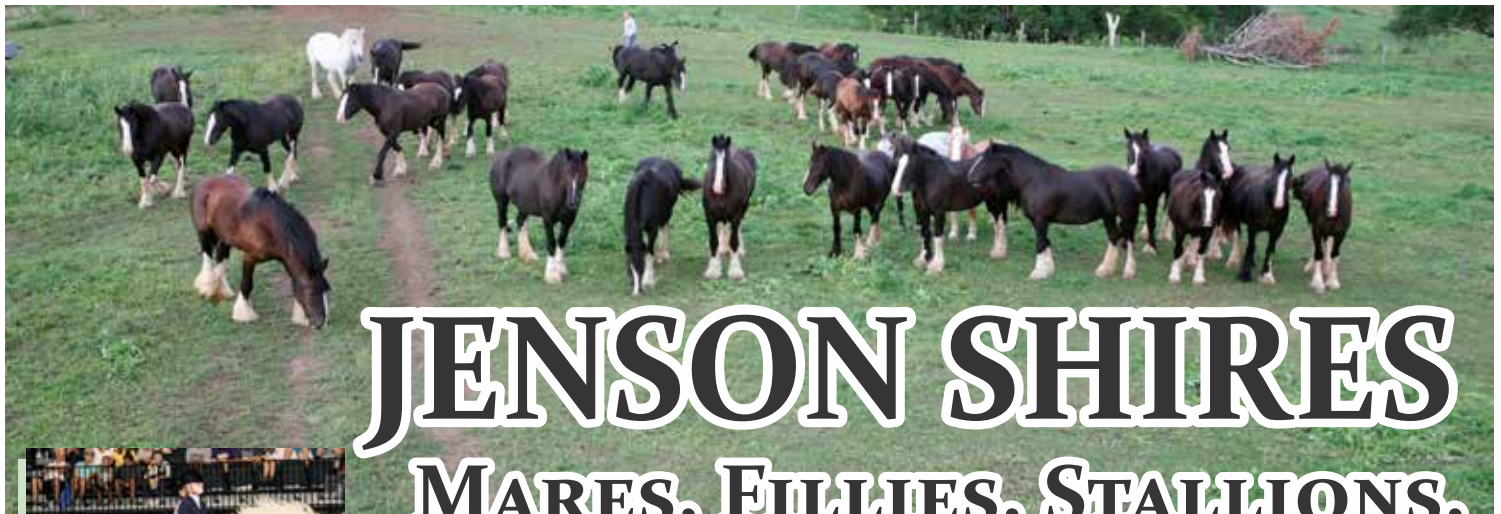

We do have a rule that states after 90 days the incompleated application is taken out of the queue and the application process will have to start over. If you need help with completing forms or tips on pulling the hair samples, please call me at 208-521-7375 or any of the board members, we are happy to help!

# 2ND QUARTER REGULAR BOARD MEETING

Tuesday, April 12, 2022, 8:00 PM EST  
Draft Board Teleconference Minutes

1. Call to order – President Wayne Wareing called the meeting to order at 8:06 PM EDT

2. Roll Call: Karla

Present: Wayne Wareing, Victoria Hauser, Hannah Barker, Tom Greenlee, Kari Moulton, Jim Paulson, Karla Stoner, Secretary Stacie Lynch.  
Dean Jenson called in later.

Absent: Clark Jenson – Jim Paulson / ? moved to excuse Clark Jenson from the meeting due to health issue with his wife, June. All in favor.

Members Present: Charity Harmon, Mathew Davis, Missy and Geryl Wade, DJ Bradshaw, Lamon Norton, Arlin Wareing, Adam Haines.

3. Approval of 2022 Annual BoD Meeting minutes – Karla reported a couple of changes from Victoria, which have not been included yet. No other input, so far. Nothing else had been received yet and due to the amount of information in the minutes, Victoria requested more time for review. The board agreed to table approval and do an email vote prior to the Q3 meeting.

4. Additions or deletions to the agenda – Karla asked if the draft job descriptions Jim sent out recently should be added to this agenda or held for the next meeting. Jim suggested tabling for next meeting. All agreed.

5 Secretary's report – Stacie (see attachment 1 for details) January 1st to March 31st.

Registrations

31 total – 24 Shires & 7 Shire sport horses

Recording que – 31 registrations for 22 customers – oldest 457 days – most are waiting on hair samples for DNA or photos.

Wayne sent messages to owners of the oldest animals in the que, telling them they had 30 days to get these completed or they would be dropped from the que and have to start the registration process over.

Transfers – 41 total

34 Shires: 13 mares, 6 stallions 6, 15 geldings

7 sport horses – 3 mares, 4 stallions

Membership numbers – 258 – Corporate: 11, Annual: 120, Lifetime: 121, Friend of the Shire:4, Junior: 2

Reminder: 2 junior memberships purchased by Bud Walsh still need to be given out.

New members 1st quarter: 16

Non-renewals from 2021 – 76

Open Work Orders – 76. Last quarter closed 29, with 34 line items

Office issues – Wayne brought up the problem with the length of time in registration que – decision was to fix the deadline @ 90 days to complete or it is canceled and applicant has to start over, including repaying registration fee. Recommended board members call individuals on the list and see what the issues are.

6. Financial Report – Stacie sent out report for Q1 and March

- 2022 Q1 - Negative income for the quarter of \$4993.45. Most due to down payment for new website design (almost \$6200). Wayne asked if contract was signed before down payment was made. Charity reported for Dean that it had been signed. Wayne requested a copy for office.
- Other – Stacie - Wells Fargo accounts now closed. All funds transferred to Chase, except for merchant services account left open, but funds are being redirected to the Chase Checking. Wells Fargo credit card still in use. New Chase credit card account being set up. Once it is active, the wells Fargo card will be closed.
- Karla reported that one of the ASHA Chase accounts lists her home address on the statements. She went to the Chase branch near her to get it corrected, but statements are still coming to her. Stacie found it was the savings account and will get the address changed.

7. Committee Reports – Wayne asked for reports of any activity since the annual meeting.

- All North American – Kari Moulton – will be using the same program as last year

No inside booth this year due to money needed for new website. Will get a report from Todd. Wayne reported Jennifer put pictures out on facebook.
- Rules – Tom Greenlee – as of now, trimming out what no longer pertains. Reviewing with rest of the committee. Going back through 2021 minutes to include changes that were voted on and add those in. 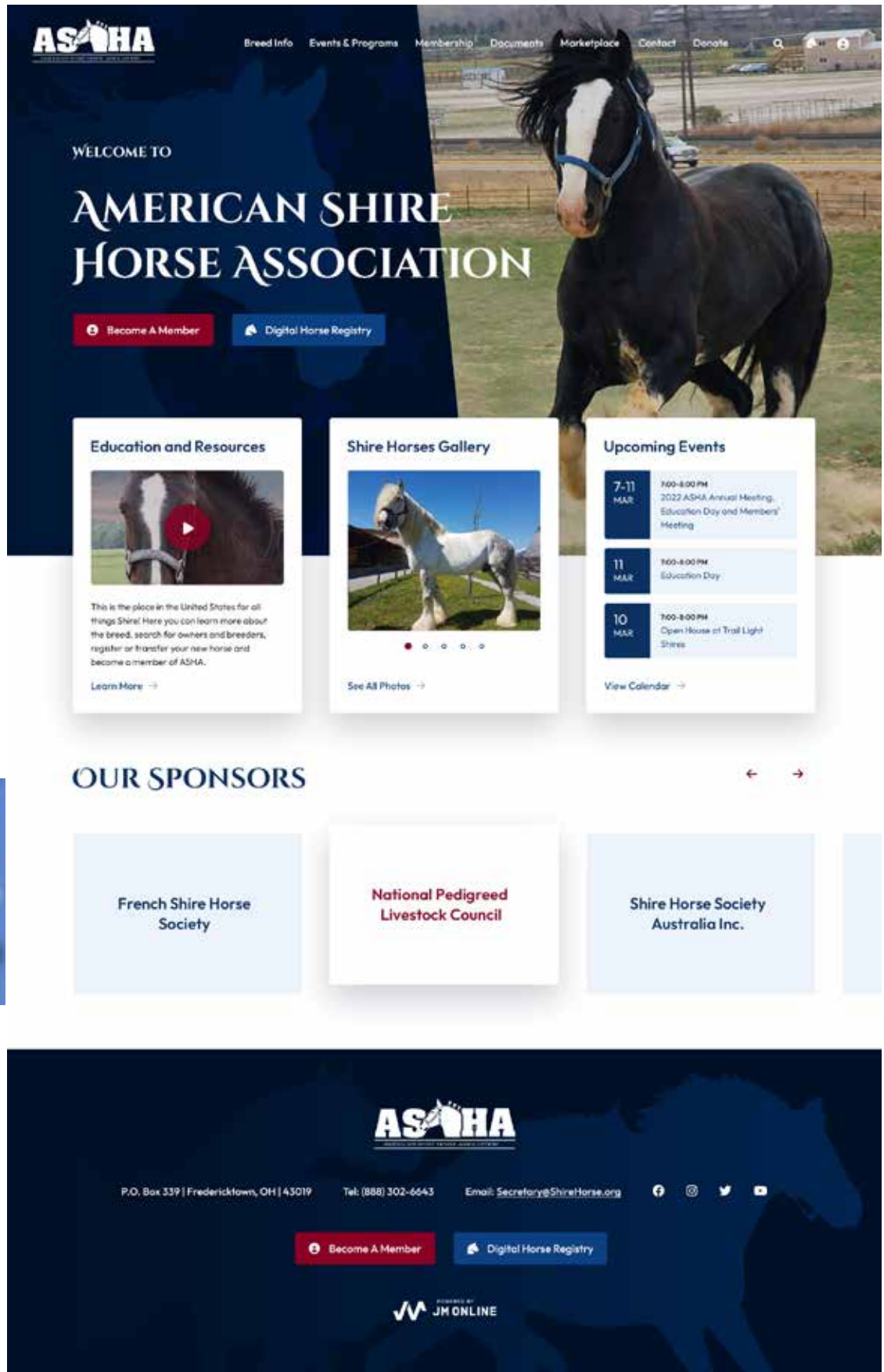

# SHIRE LITERATURE REVIEW

In an effort to assist Arlin Wareing in his upcoming book on the history of the Shire, I have amassed a pretty extensive library of my own, as well as quite a few historical artifacts. My intention is to share more titles in each Newsletter, but Arlin's book will have a complete list of references. Eventually we may publish a literature review but in the meantime we're willing to share titles and authors to help support your own exploration. Enjoy the read!

Frederic Street originally published his book *The History of The Shire Horse and the Origin of the English Cart Horse Society* in 1883 and it is widely available through Amazon and eBay as a 2018 reprint. This book was a game-changer for Arlin and I because it not only includes a record of the first formation of the organization that came to be known as the Shire Horse Society, it also includes information about the development of the breed registry.

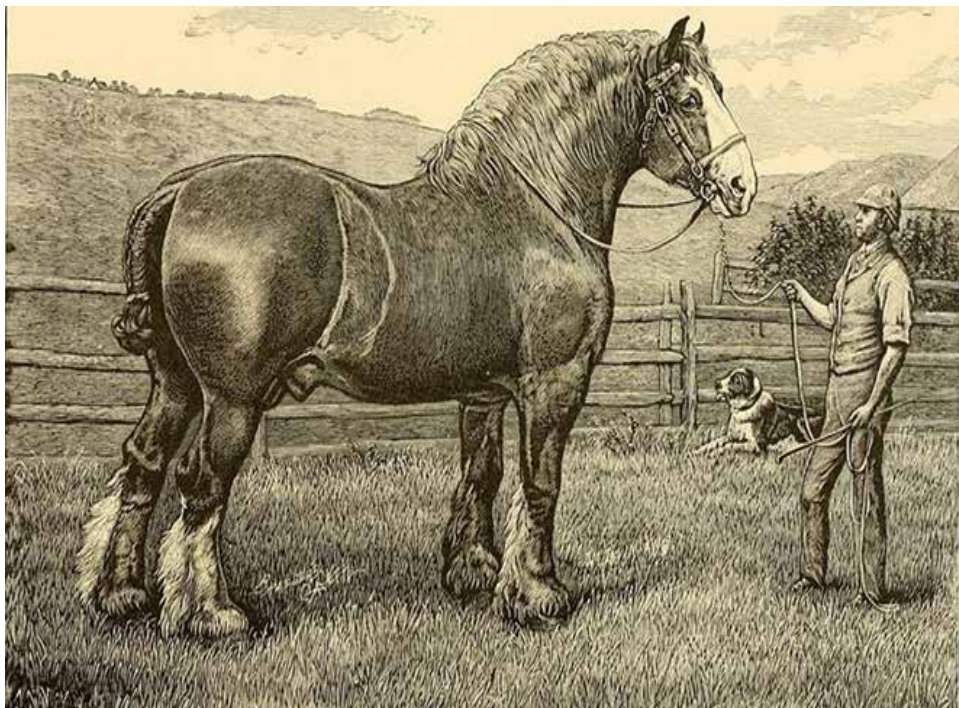
The English Clydesdale Horse Society and the Suffolk Horse Society were formed in 1877 and there were already registries for the major horse breeds, so we wondered if the remaining draft horses were simply gathered up and included in the Cart Horse Society. Most emphatically not. According to Street, they focused on horses with breeding records that went back to the 1700's to prove their lineage and they had a specific type in mind.

I was stuck in the San Francisco airport when my flight from Los Angeles to Seattle was redirected and, instead of trying to keep track of how many times they changed my flight home due to the fog, I pulled Street's book out of my bag. At first I skimmed it to get a feel for the content and

I landed on a paragraph where Street describes the confirmation of a Shire. Something was off so I went back and read more, then more, then re-read the description, then called the only person who would not kill me for calling her at 11:30 p.m. to talk about something I had read- my mother, Louise Reuble. She listened to the description and got it immediately because she was on the American Shire Horse Association Board of Directors in the 1970's when they were working on the breed standards and had spent hours looking at old and modern images of Shires. Street was describing Shires as they looked during his era, not a modern Shire.

Street's book was more meaningful for Arlin because when he first started traveling to England in the late 60's to import Shires, the breeders were very intentional about the confirmation of their horses. The pre-world war Shire resembled Street's description of a heavy legged massive horse with a lot of feather and thick mane and tail, but that horse, what Arlin refers to as the Lincolnshire type, proved less successful as they were prone to arthritis and had a short working life. The Leicestershire type that became the focus after World War II represents the modern Shire and they are a more balanced animal with higher endurance and agility

The difference between the two types is discussed at length in Arlin's book, which should be released this summer, but Street's book is important because it establishes a baseline for the Shire without speculation. It also provides detail on the formation of the Cart Horse Society that was renamed the Shire Horse Society in 1884. The group of men who sat on the formation committee were members of the London Farmers' Club, which still exists today as a hotel and restaurant. They do have a library

and archives, but I think it would take a visit in person and a lot of asking to access their materials and confirm Street’s recollection of events.

Street also describes the cost of Shires, breeding practices and upkeep, and provides a list of winners from various shows. There is also a description of the first stud book that was published in 1880 and how it was assembled. I would highly recommend looking for a copy, the reprint is usually listed as Shire Horse Stud Book, Volume 1, though it is a harder find. There are several articles at the beginning of the book and the entries for the horses are really interesting because they list color and location as well as breeder. There were definitely more bay Shires than black so the reference of a Shire being the “Old English Black Horse” is somewhat misleading.

Due to the original publication date and country of origin, there is some vocabulary in Street’s book that may be unfamiliar, but it is otherwise an accessible quick read. # REPRODUCTION CLASS

On April 13-14, 2022, Royal Knight Shires of Bedford, VA, owned by Geryl & Missy Wade, hosted a private two-day Reproduction Class offered by The Breeder's Assistant. Instructor David Riddle traveled from Tomball, TX to lecture and offer hands on practice in Equine Ultrasound and Equine Stallion Collection /Evaluation/ Freezing Stallion Semen. For each class, straight forward detailed books were included.

Students were able to lodge at the Wade's home and included Charity Harmon, Northeast Shires from PA, Matthew Davis, Alder Shires from TN, Tracy Jenson, Jenson Shires from NE, and Missy Wade, Royal Knight Shires

from VA. Geryl Wade assisted with the stallion collecting.

again after a good breakfast and clearing the table, we started at 8 AM learning about collecting stallion semen, evaluating it, and how to freeze it. After lunch, we headed to the barn to try and collect some semen. This was a good three hour task as none of our stallions had ever been trained to use the phantom, or it had been many years. We patiently worked with three of five stallions, making good progress, but unable to collect any semen, which we desperately needed in order to learn how to freeze it. Geryl commented, "I guess I can go get the @\$\$hole." This is the stallion that you need to be on your toes, a little harder to handle, unlike all the others that you can just raise your voice and shake the chain.

David, our instructor said "go get the @\$\$hole." As Geryl led the stallion down and approached the phantom, everyone thought the stallion was going to jump the phantom and mount the mare, but once he reared, Geryl pulled him toward the phantom and up he went. Well, this did the trick; we were able to get an entire bottle full of semen to use. Later, David commented that usually the harder to handle stallions take to the phantom easier.

On the first day, after the breakfast dishes were cleared from the dining room, class started at 8 AM sharp. We learned to read an ultrasound machine, track the reproductive tract of a mare, and detect embryos, follicles, edema and possible fluid on the uterus of the mare, and how to treat it. After lunch we headed to the barn and practiced ultrasounding mares. Even though we all had ultrasounded in the past, we were able to practice until we felt comfortable with finding and viewing the different anatomy parts.

On day two,

After collecting the semen and going into the lab; there was more than enough for all four students to practice freezing. We started the process, which the beginning steps are all the same whether using for cooled or freezing. After viewing under the microscope to make sure it was good viable semen, which it was good, but technically not good enough to actually freeze, because when freezing semen that will last indefinitely; the best high

quality semen is needed. This was the stallion's first ejaculation of the year, and you need to have about three ejaculations, which are called cleanouts to get to the best quality semen that the stallion has.

After viewing under the microscope to determine quality, the semen had to be extended in order to put into the centrifuge and spun down. This is the same extender used if cooling the semen to ship. The goal of spinning the semen in a centrifuge is to compact the semen into the bottom of the tube, which will increase the quantity of semen available. Then the extender is removed leaving a "pellet" of semen that needs re-extended with a freezing extender in order to be stored in liquid nitrogen indefinitely. We had four combinations of cooling and freezing extenders to determine which worked best on this stallion. After freezing the semen, we then thawed it and reviewed under a microscope to check the quantity and quality of the semen. This is called a test freeze that needs to be done on all stallion semen to determine which combination of extenders stores best for them. We practiced well into the night, ending class around 9:30 PM. Everyone was exhausted, but the information learned was well worth it.

This was a shortened class packed full of high quality information and hands on experience, which all four students would highly recommend to anyone wanting to learn about reproduction, to take from The Breeder's Assistant. They offer classes in Tomball, Texas or you can get them to teach a private class.

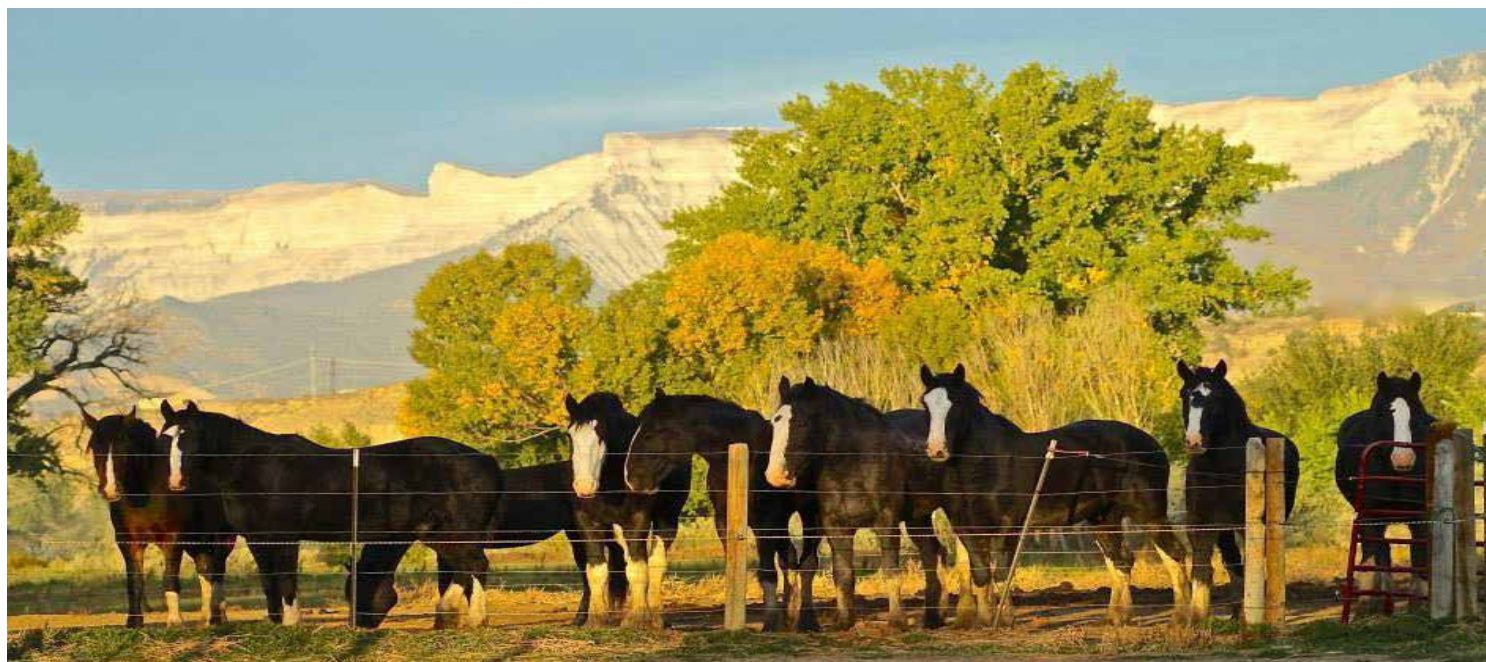

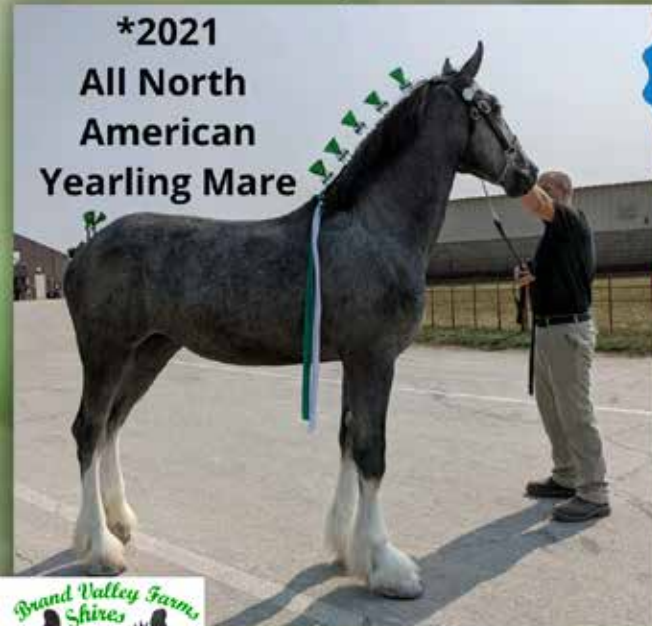
